Chico Palio Horse Requirements

1. Round dowels (for maximum racing comfort) of at least 2 inches thick (think closet rods) and about eight feet long.
2. At least two healthy humans to carry your horse creation. Under 18 must be accompanied an adult.
3. Platform measuring no less than 2-feet wide and 4-feet in length for the base of your horse.
4. Words are discouraged on the horse, however, a sign should accompany the horse to identify the team, neighborhood, business or community group.
